## REFEREE RESPONSIBILITIES \& LIABILITIES- SOME.

The first duty, most important, of a Referee, in scholastic soccer, is Safety.
Field. Arrive early to inspect \& walk field, for hazard potential \& rule compliance.
Danger zone: hole in ground, weather puddles, objects near or on field, loose goal.

Benches -minimum- 10 feet away from the touchlines. At $1 / 2$ way line, 20 YARDS gap between benches .Space left for scorer table, officials \& sub area. Allow neither team, player nor Coach, to encroach, onto opposing bench area. Never let spectators behind the goals. Corner Flags, not less than 5 feet high.

No flag substitute, of hard materials allowed. In sub varsity games, softcloth/nylon jackets have been used, 〔If Flags unavailable to place, at corners\} as safe item.

Until kick-off, school home administrators are responsible for field safety \& playing ability. Once ball is in play, the Referees are responsible \& fully liable to ensure safety, play-ability. Due possibly to : weather, equipment issue, injury, Coach or spectator misbehavior or unusual problem.

> Adornment Nothing worn to 'look good’- jewelry- earing -is illegal . Religious head gear OK, if not hard abrasive or metal/hard materials, worn tightly. Religious or medical bracelet if worn, it must be taped to body or uniform.

Hair control devices must be soft to touch. Some are sharp \& have drawn blood, after an opponent, brushed against them. Ref overlooked, pre game.

Spectator Misconduct. If a spectator or parent seeks you out-avoid them. Do NOT talk or engage. Let home, Coach deal with whomever.
If confrontation- physically- you are pushed or the like, etc:

## DO NOT FIGHT BACK! Liability.

Go to bench area or get together with other Ref. If need be (assault)-go to Police station to report. Call assignor right away.
